From the readings for Sunday 14th April

A reflection on this week's readings

The God of Abraham, and of Isaac, and of Jacob, the God of our fathers, hath glorified his Son Jesus And his name through faith in his name hath made this man strong, whom ye see and know: yea, the faith which is by him hath given him this perfect soundness in the presence of you all.

AV (King James Bible)

The God of Abraham and of Isaac and of Jacob, the God of our fathers, glorified his servant Jesus ... And his name, by faith in his name, has made this man strong whom you see and know; and the faith which is through Jesus has given the man this perfect health in the presence of you all.

RSV

It is the God of Abraham and Isaac and Jacob, the God of our fathers, who has done this thing to honour his servant Jesus.... It is the name of this same Jesus, it is faith in that name, which has cured this man whom you see and recognise. Yes, it was faith in Christ which gave this man perfect health and strength in full view of you all.

The God of Abraham, Isaac, and Jacob, the God of our ancestors, has given divine glory to his Servant Jesus... It was the power of his name that gave strength to this lame man. What you see and know was done by faith in his name; it was faith in Jesus that has made him well, as you can all see.

Good News Bible

The God of Abraham and Isaac and Jacob, the God of our ancestors, has glorified his Son Jesus.... Faith in Jesus' name put this man, whose condition you know so well, on his feet—yes, faith and nothing but faith put this man healed and whole right before your eyes.

The Message

This week I want to share with you what may seem a rather strange reflection, because it's based on a misreading of the text. When I first glanced at v.16: "It was the power of his name that gave strength to this lame man" (in the Good News translation) I thought Peter was referring to himself as the "lame man", to the Peter who fled, alone and terrified, after Gethsemane, who was then drawn to follow Jesus but denied him three times, and wept bitterly at cock-crow. Then I realised my mistake, that in fact Peter, channelling the power of the risen Christ, had just performed the Christ-like miracle of healing a lame man. But the misreading stayed with me...

William Empson, a brilliant if often obscure poet and critic of the 1930s-1950s, wrote a book called "Seven Types of Ambiguity". In it, though himself a committed atheist, he produced some of the most sensitive and insightful readings of 17th century religious poetry, particularly of George Herbert. He argued that in poetic writing the language often permitted more than one reading, and this produced a complex and satisfying meaning which, so to speak, hovered above the text and could be grasped if we allow ourselves to hold the various readings in creative tension.

So maybe this misreading is more than just a silly mistake. It allows us to think of how, in spite of our weaknesses, we can channel the power of the risen Christ in our own lives. St Paul writes: "If Christ has not been raised, then our preaching is in vain" (I Cor 15:14). We may not have the gift of performing healing miracles, but let us pray that a living faith in the risen Christ can overcome our fears of death and emptiness, and that we can build on this faith to live well and hopefully.
