A reflection on this week's readings

From the readings for Sunday 28th April

John 15:1-5

I am the true vine, and my Father is the husbandman. Every branch in me that beareth not fruit he taketh away: and every *branch* that beareth fruit, he purgeth it, that it may bring forth more fruit. Now ye are clean through the word which I have spoken unto you. Abide in me, and I in you. As the branch cannot bear fruit of itself, except it abide in the vine; no more can ye, except ye abide in me. I am the vine, ye *are* the branches.

AV (King James Version)

I am the true vine, and my Father is the vinedresser. Every branch of mine that bears no fruit, he takes away, and every branch that does bear fruit he prunes, that it may bear more fruit. You are already made clean by the word which I have spoken to you. Abide in me, and I in you. As the branch cannot bear fruit by itself, unless it abides in the vine, neither can you, unless you abide in me. I am the vine, you are the branches.

RSV

I am the real vine, and my Father is the gardener. He breaks off every branch in me that does not bear fruit, and he prunes every branch that does bear fruit, so that it will be clean and bear more fruit. You have been made clean already by the teaching I have given you. Remain united to me, and I will remain united to you. A branch cannot bear fruit by itself; it can do so only if it remains in the vine. In the same way you cannot bear fruit unless you remain in me. I am the vine, and you are the branches.

Good News Bible

I am the Real Vine and my Father is the Farmer. He cuts off every branch of me that doesn't bear grapes. And every branch that is grape-bearing he prunes back so it will bear even more. You are already pruned back by the message I have spoken. Live in me. Make your home in me just as I do in you. In the same way that a branch can't bear grapes by itself but only by being joined to the vine, you can't bear fruit unless you are joined with me. I am the Vine, you are the branches.

The Message

One major difference between John and the other three gospels is his treatment of the Last Supper. Most of chapters 13-17 consists of a series of discourses by Jesus, addressed to his disciples and to posterity about himself, his relationship to the Father, and their role once he has gone. The tone is solemn, stressing the importance of the occasion and the content. Today's reading, of which this extract is the first part only, uses the technique of repetition with significant variation to reinforce and develop the message. The half-verse with which this extract concludes is the hinge linking the two sections.

St Paul in his letters often speaks of the importance of living "in Christ"; today's reading offers an extended meditation on what this might mean in terms of *letting Christ live in us*, as the only way in which we can be our best selves and fulfil our true potential.

These chapters from John lend themselves particularly well to the traditional technique of prayerful reading known as *lectio divina* – the repeated reading of, and meditation on, a short passage, letting the words slowly sink in, noting what associations they bring up for us (like watching the ripples spreading in a pond when a stone has dropped in), and seeking the guidance of the Holy Spirit in discerning what their meaning and application might be in our own lives.
