

YOUR CHANCE TO OWN A PIECE OF WANSTEAD HISTORY! We have received a Faculty to remove a set of pews at Christ Church (the ones to the right, immediately as you come into the church, going towards the back). There are nine pews which will be removed. This will make way for an area for welcoming, storage and for a table and chairs, as well as making it easier to reach the lighting cupboard. This means we have nine pews to dispose of! Would anyone like one? They are made of stained pine, and were probably installed after Christ Church was extended in the late 1870s. The pews have a bookrest on the back and several of them have numbers inscribed on them. This is because in the 19th Century many families would 'rent' their pew, although some of the less good pews would be kept free for the poor. The numbers on the pews in Christ Church are not in any order, which suggests they have either been moved around at some point, possibly when the church was enlarged, or perhaps some came from another church. Each pew is small enough to fit alongside a normal size dining table: length 7ft exactly, depth (including bookstand at back) 18 1/2", height to top of pew 34", height to seat 16". You are welcome to come and take a look at the pews during normal church opening hours. If you decide you would like a pew, could we suggest a donation of £50 to the Inspire Wanstead campaign to save the tower. You would need to arrange collection during October. 
VOLUNTEERS NEEDED TO COOK FOR THE NIGHT SHELTER: We help to run the Forest Churches Night Shelter throughout the winter months. Starting on the 1st November and running through to the start of April, the shelter provides beds and warm meals for homeless people in north-east London. You might recall that in the old days we used to run this from the parish halls, but now it is all run in conjunction with the YMCA on Forest Road, Walthamstow. This enables service users to have a proper bed and a shower, as well as an evening meal, and means people don't have to pack up their belongings every night to travel to a new church hall the next day. Wanstead volunteers' night at the shelter is Tuesdays. The volunteers cook a meal at home for about 12-15 people, and then take it along to the shelter in Walthamstow, serve it up and eat with the service users. Afterwards, the volunteers clear up and chat or play some board games with the service users. Volunteers are always paired-up and a professional member of staff is on hand at all times to assist. You don't need to stay overnight. The meal is usually served about 6.45pm and the shift is over by 9.30pm. People who volunteered last year really enjoyed the experience and the interactions they had, and we were all on it wasn't only about five times throughout the winter, arduous. If you would like to volunteer to cook or to assist, please contact the parish office.
