# A reflection on this week's readings:

## From the readings for Sunday 7 December

Matt 3:1-12

In those days came John the Baptist, preaching in the wilderness of Judæa... For this is he that was spoken of by the prophet Esaias, saying, The voice of one crying in the wilderness, Prepare ye the way of the Lord, make his paths straight...Then went out to him Jerusalem and all Judæa... and were baptized of him in Jordan, confessing their sins. But when he saw many of the Pharisees and Sadducees come to his baptism, he said unto them, O generation of vipers, who hath warned you to flee from the wrath to come? ... And now also the axe is laid unto the root of the trees: therefore every tree which bringeth not forth good fruit is hewn down, and cast into the fire. I indeed baptize you with water unto repentance: but he that cometh after me is mightier than I...he shall baptize you with the Holy Ghost, and with fire.

AV (King James Bible)

In those days came John the Baptist, preaching in the wilderness of Judea... For this is he who was spoken of by the prophet Isaiah when he said, "The voice of one crying in the wilderness: Prepare the way of the Lord, make his paths straight." Then went out to him Jerusalem and all Judea... and they were baptized by him in the river Jordan, confessing their sins. But when he saw many of the Pharisees and Sadducees coming for baptism, he said to them, "You brood of vipers! Who warned you to flee from the wrath to come? ... Even now the axe is laid to the root of the trees; every tree therefore that does not bear good fruit is cut down and thrown into the fire. I baptize you with water for repentance, but he who is coming after me is mightier than I ... he will baptize you with the Holy Spirit and with fire."

Today's reading is in many ways classic Advent material: John the Baptist is represented by one of our four candles, while the quotation from Isaiah (40:3) features in practically every Advent liturgy and celebration. But the Advent message, as we saw last week, is complicated and there's more to this well-known story than meets the eye. The basic outline – the emergence of the shaggily-clad prophet calling all and sundry to a "baptism of repentance" – is to be found at the very beginning of Mark's gospel, but in both Matthew and Luke it's the beginning of chapter 3, following their (completely different) accounts of Jesus' birth. Matthew and Luke both weave into Mark's brief account a raft of additional material – all the words of anger and judgment starting with "brood of vipers". This material is almost (not completely) identical in the two gospels, suggesting that they are combining Mark's account with another, otherwise unknown, source. It's only Matthew who identifies the targets of John's wrath as "Pharisees and Sadducees"; Luke gives the impression that these words are addressed to the crowd in general. Also Luke, who shows a strong concern for social justice, incorporates this theme with John slating the soldiers and tax-collectors for oppressing the poor.

What is this other source? We can only get close to it by identifying all the material which is common to Matthew and Luke, but is not in Mark (assuming, as most Bible scholars do, that Mark is the earliest gospel). This otherwise unknown source is rather intriguingly known as Q, from the German word Quelle, "source" – related to the English word "well", which originally meant "spring". It seems to have been a book of the sayings or teachings of Jesus, with little or no narrative content; it's generally thought to be early, but all we can be sure of is that it's older than whichever is earlier of Matthew or Luke. It may have contained more material, now lost because not included in our gospels. It has given rise to some interesting theories about who Jesus originally was, and how the story developed, but ultimately this is just speculation and much of it depends on circular arguments.

We saw last week that Advent is a time for self-reflection, involving the idea of facing judgment. What the Q material adds to Mark's rather quick-fire account of John's baptism campaign is a sense of the seriousness of the need for repentance (*metanoia* or change of thinking). The call to judgment is ultimately a hopeful one, but it is not to be trivialised.

Lord, help us to use this Advent period to reflect on our need to see more clearly and live more truly the lives that you intend and desire for us.
