A reflection on this week's readings

From the readings for Sunday June 15

Romans 5:1-5

Therefore being justified by faith, we have peace with God through our Lord Jesus Christ: by whom also we have access by faith into this grace wherein we stand, and rejoice in hope of the glory of God. And not only so, but we glory in tribulations also: knowing that tribulation worketh patience; and patience, experience; and experience, hope: and hope maketh not ashamed; because the love of God is shed abroad in our hearts by the Holy Ghost which is given unto us.

Therefore, since we are justified by faith, we have peace with God through our Lord Jesus Christ. Through him we have obtained access to this grace in which we stand, and we rejoice in our hope of sharing the glory of God. More than that, we rejoice in our sufferings, knowing that suffering produces endurance, and endurance produces character, and character produces hope, and hope does not disappoint us, because God's love has been poured into our hearts through the Holy Spirit which has been given to us. **RSV**

Since then it is by faith that we are justified ... we have peace with God through our Lord Jesus Christ. Through him we have confidently entered into this new relationship of grace, and here we take our stand, in happy certainty of the glorious things he has for us in the future. This doesn't mean, of course, that we have only a hope of future joys—we can be full of joy here and now even in our trials and troubles. Taken in the right spirit, these very things will give us patient endurance; this in turn will develop a mature character, and a character of this sort produces a steady hope, a hope that will never disappoint us. Already we have some experience of the love of God flooding through our hearts by the Holy Spirit given to us.

Now that we have been put right with God through faith, we have peace with God through our Lord Jesus Christ. He has brought us by faith into this experience of God's grace, in which we now live. And so we boast of the hope we have of sharing God's glory! We also boast of our troubles, because we know that trouble produces endurance, endurance brings God's approval, and his approval creates hope. This hope does not disappoint us, for God has poured out his love into our hearts by means of the Holy Spirit, who is God's gift to us.

Good News Bible

Paul's letter to the Romans has been called the Mount Everest of New Testament studies, a magnificent eminence, but full of challenges and difficult passages. Today's reading comes at the beginning of a section (chapters 5-8) on the infinite love of God for fallen humanity, culminating in the overwhelming promises of 8:26 (quoted in last week's reflection!) and 8:38-39: "Neither death, nor life ... nor height, nor depth, nor anything else in all creation, will be able to separate us from the love of God in Christ Jesus our Lord." (RSV)

At the end of chapter 4, Paul has just told us how Abraham's trust in God "was reckoned to him as righteousness." (Gen 15:6), which is why today's reading begins: "Now that we have been put right with God through faith" (GNB). The all-too-familiar phrase "justification by faith" is in some ways unhelpful; (a) the Greek word translated "faith" also means "trust", and (b) "justification" isn't quite right either (though of course it's sanctified by long use). The GNB translation "being put right with God" seems to me closer to what Paul's getting at. Perhaps we should say something like "being made righteous through our trust in God". It's not about coming out on the right side of a moral argument, more about being in a state of grace. On the other hand, the GNB's "boast of our troubles" feels quite wrong; Tom Wright points out that while we rejoice in (that is because of) our hope, we don't rejoice "in" our troubles in the same way. We're not masochists, but we have something to rejoice in when troubles come, as they surely will. Perhaps Phillips, though a bit long-winded, comes closest of all the versions here to the right meaning.

Lord, help us to share Paul's sense of wonder at the richness of your gifts, and at the sheer strength of the love shown to us through Christ Jesus your Son.
