A reflection on this week's readings

From the readings for Sunday 19 October

Luke 18:1-8

He spake a parable unto them to this end, that men ought always to pray, and not to faint; saying, There was in a city a judge, which feared not God, neither regarded man: and there was a widow in that city; and she came unto him, saying, Avenge me of mine adversary. And he would not for a while: but afterward he said within himself, Though I fear not God, nor regard man; yet because this widow troubleth me, I will avenge her, lest by her continual coming she weary me.'... Hear what the unjust judge saith. And shall not God avenge his own elect, which cry day and night unto him... I tell you that he will avenge them speedily. Nevertheless when the Son of man cometh, shall he find faith on the earth?

AV (King James Bible)

He told them a parable, to the effect that they ought always to pray and not lose heart. "In a certain city there was a judge who neither feared God nor regarded man; and there was a widow in that city who kept coming to him and saying, 'Vindicate me against my adversary.' For a while he refused; but afterward he said to himself, 'Though I neither fear God nor regard man, yet because this widow bothers me, I will vindicate her, or she will wear me out by her continual coming.' ... Hear what the unrighteous judge says. And will not God vindicate his elect, who cry to him day and night? ... I tell you, he will vindicate them speedily. Nevertheless, when the Son of man comes, will he find faith on earth?"

Jesus told them a story showing that it was necessary for them to pray consistently and never quit. "There was once a judge in some city who never gave God a thought and cared nothing for people. A widow in that city kept after him: 'My rights are being violated. Protect me!' He never gave her the time of day. But after this went on and on he said to himself, 'I care nothing what God thinks, even less what people think. But because this widow won't quit badgering me, I'd better do something and see that she gets justice—otherwise I'm going to end up beaten black-and-blue by her pounding.' ... Do you hear what that judge, corrupt as he is, is saying? So what makes you think God won't step in and work justice for his chosen people, who continue to cry out for help? ... I assure you, he will. He will not drag his feet. But how much of that kind of persistent faith will the Son of Man find on the earth when he returns?"

Another baffling parable – so much so that Luke felt he had to explain the point before telling it! One clue to what's going on is the verb *hypopiazo*, translated "weary me" in King James or "wear me out" in the RSV. It can mean either to really annoy someone, or literally to give them a black eye – so it's a comic cliché of a metaphor, a bit like calling someone a pain in the neck. (The Message manages to get the comedic exaggeration of this rather well.) Jesus is telling a serious story in a light-hearted way – we're certainly not supposed to see God as really like an unjust judge, though it recognises that he can sometimes seem like that when our prayers are not answered as we would wish.

But losing heart in prayer is no laughing matter; it can lead to a sense of weariness, emptiness and despair. We may laugh at the absurd image of the battling widow, apparently wasting her energy by futilely banging on the judge's door – doesn't she know she's on a hiding to nothing? And yet she's in a much better place than the person who has lost heart and given up hope. She may be deeply frustrated, with no obvious rational grounds for hope, but she's focused and energetic, she knows exactly who she is and what she wants. Perhaps that's the real point of the story – if we can find it within ourselves to persist in prayer, never giving up, then we may surprisingly find our faith strengthened despite the frustration of our prayers not being answered. The Message makes explicit what the original and the older translations only hinted at – that it's the widow's combative never-say-die type of faith that Jesus would hope to find when he returns to earth – though the wistful tone of the question rather suggests that he doesn't expect to find as much of it as he would have liked.

Dear Lord, we ask that you send your Holy Spirit to strengthen our faith at those times when it seems that our prayers are not heard, and we are tempted to lose heart and give in to despair.
