A reflection on this week's readings

From the readings for Sunday 18 May

And as I began to speak, the Holy Ghost fell on them, as on us at the beginning. Then remembered I the word of the Lord, how that he said, John indeed baptized with water; but ye shall be baptized with the Holy Ghost. Forasmuch then as God gave them the like gift as *he did* unto us, who believed on the Lord Jesus Christ; what was I, that I could withstand God? When they heard these things, they held their peace, and glorified God, saying, Then hath God also to the Gentiles granted repentance unto life. **AV (King James Bible)**

"As I began to speak, the Holy Spirit fell on them just as on us at the beginning. And I remembered the word of the Lord, how he said, 'John baptized with water, but you shall be baptized with the Holy Spirit.' If then God gave the same gift to them as he gave to us when we believed in the Lord Jesus Christ, who was I that I could withstand God?" When they heard this they were silenced. And they glorified God, saying, "Then to the Gentiles also God has granted repentance unto life." **RSV**

"While I was beginning to tell them this message the Holy Spirit fell upon them just as on us at the beginning. There came into my mind the words of our Lord when he said, 'John indeed baptised with water, but you will be baptised with the Holy Spirit.' If then God gave them exactly the same gift as he gave to us when we believed on the Lord Jesus Christ, who was I to think that I could hinder the working of God?" When they heard this they had no further objection to raise. And they praised God, saying, "Then obviously God has given to the Gentiles as well the gift of repentance which leads to life."

"So I started in, talking. Before I'd spoken half a dozen sentences, the Holy Spirit fell on them just as he did on us the first time. I remembered Jesus' words: 'John baptized with water; you will be baptized with the Holy Spirit.' So I ask you: If God gave the same exact gift to them as to us when we believed in the Master Jesus Christ, how could I object to God?" Hearing it all laid out like that, they quieted down. And then, as it sank in, they started praising God. "It's really happened! God has broken through to the other nations, opened them up to Life!"

Acts of the Apostles is a curious and interesting book, a precious record of the early decades of the Church, but *not* a straightforward history. It's a carefully shaped literary account whose basic theme is a Spirit-driven movement from the Temple in Jerusalem, heart of the Jewish world, to Rome, the centre of the wider Mediterranean and Gentile world. In the first third of the book, Peter is the central figure; later on it's Paul. Today's reading comes as this focus shifts. We've already had the account of Paul's vision on the road to Damascus, but for now Peter is still centre stage. *His* vision setting aside the strict Jewish kosher laws is crucial, and his controversial but Spirit-driven decision to baptise the Roman centurion Cornelius and his family marks a decisive step in opening up the Christian message of salvation to the wider Gentile world, which will later be at the heart of Paul's mission.

One of the devices Luke uses in Acts to emphasise "Strong Message Here!" is repeated narration; we hear of Paul's Damascus experience three times, and this account by Peter is a detailed summary of what we've already been told directly in ch.10. The Jewish Christians in Jerusalem, initially critical of Peter, were clearly won round by the evident signs that his actions were God-inspired. May we be equally open to the breath of the Holy Spirit blowing in unexpected places in our own lives.
