A reflection on this week's readings

From the readings for Sunday 22 June

Before faith came, we were kept under the law, shut up unto the faith which should afterwards be revealed... Wherefore the law was our schoolmaster to bring us unto Christ... But after that faith is come... ye are all the children of God by faith in Christ Jesus. For as many of you as have been baptized into Christ have put on Christ. There is neither Jew nor Greek, there is neither bond nor free, there is neither male nor female: for ye are all one in Christ Jesus. And if ye be Christ's, then are ye Abraham's seed, and heirs according to the promise.

AV (King James Bible)

Before faith came, we were confined under the law, kept under restraint until faith should be revealed... So that the law was our custodian until Christ came ... But now that faith has come... in Christ Jesus you are all sons of God, through faith. For as many of you as were baptized into Christ have put on Christ. There is neither Jew nor Greek, there is neither slave nor free, there is neither male nor female; for you are all one in Christ Jesus. And if you are Christ's, then you are Abraham's offspring, heirs according to promise

Galatians 3:23-29

Before the coming of faith we were all imprisoned under the power of the Law, with our only hope of deliverance the faith that was to be shown to us... Or the Law was like a strict governess in charge of us until we went to the school of Christ ... Now that you have faith in Christ ... you are all sons of God. All of you who were baptised "into" Christ have put on the family likeness of Christ. Gone is the distinction between Jew and Greek, slave and free man, male and female—you are all one in Christ Jesus. And if you belong to Christ, you are true descendants of Abraham, you are true heirs of his promise.

Before the time for faith came, the Law kept us all locked up as prisoners until this coming faith should be revealed... And so the Law was in charge of us until Christ came ... Now that the time for faith is here ... all of you are God's children in union with Christ Jesus. You were baptized into union with Christ, and now you are clothed, so to speak, with the life of Christ himself. So there is no difference between Jews and Gentiles, between slaves and free people, between men and women; you are all one in union with Christ Jesus. If you belong to Christ, then you are the descendants of Abraham and will receive what God has promised.

Good News Bible

For Paul the relationship between Jewish law (i.e. the Torah, the Law of Moses) and the Christian faith was a key issue, to which he kept returning. From a pastoral point of view he insists firmly that Jewish laws such as circumcision and kosher food rules are not binding on non-Jewish Christians, and one thing that makes him really very angry, here and e.g. in Philippians 3:2-11 (our reading on Passion Sunday) is any attempt to argue that they should be. Personally, though, the issue was an uncomfortable one, since he'd been proud of his upbringing as a strict and observant Pharisee and he must have felt real inner conflict; this emerges in Phil 3 where he lists his proud Jewish credentials only to describe them as "dung" compared to the gift of faith in Christ. In Romans he wrestles with these issues at great length, seeming at times almost to suggest that the Mosaic Law is a snare and a cause of sin. No wonder that, as we saw last week, his favourite OT reference is to Abraham whose "faith was accounted to him as righteousness"; here again those who belong to Christ are the true descendants of Abraham and inheritors of the history and the promise of the OT. The Law is characterised as a paidagogos, a trusted slave responsible for ensuring a child's education, variously translated as "custodian", "disciplinarian" (NRSV), or rather charmingly by Phillips as a "strict governess". It's not a hostile characterisation, but it's definitely something whose usefulness has expired now that we are, as it were, adults in the faith and (in one throwaway line of breathtaking radicalism) equal "in Christ" whether Jew or Greek, slave or free, male or female. Arguably the church has spent the last 2,000 years trying to come to terms with this (though Paul believed that Second Coming was imminent, so the practical implications were somewhat reduced).

Lord, help us to reflect on and share Paul's vision of freedom, maturity and mutual love in Christ.
